Alberta-wide Book Borrowing



How Interlibrary loans work:

Occasionally, we may not have the book you are looking for and neither does Chinook Arch. We can often request the book (DVD, etc) from other Alberta library systems. When you pick up your interlibrary loan, it will have a yellow slip around the cover. If your yellow slip has a pink sticker, that item cannot be renewed for you and must be returned within the 21 day time frame. If you have a plain yellow slip, you can request a renewal but it must be at least 5 days before it's due date. The renewal is at the consideration of the owning library.
